## Cooperative Reading

When reading, I can:
$\checkmark$ try my best to read the text with expression
$\checkmark$ use strategies to help myself if I get stuck

- say a word that would make sense and keep reading
- leave out the word and keep reading
- reread the sentence and then keep reading
- look for a little word in the big one - look at the first part of the word and guess
- cover the prefix or suffix and see if I can work out the rest of the word - check the pictures or diagrams - sound out the word
$\checkmark$ ask for help if I need it
$\checkmark$ stop reading at an exciting part and make a prediction about what will happen next or see what others think might happen next (then read on to check or change my prediction)

When listening, I can:
$\checkmark$ give my attention to the reader
$\checkmark$ think about what I am hearing, maybe by making movies in my head
$\checkmark$ let the reader try his or her best to solve problems on their own before offering to help
$\checkmark \quad$ help the reader if the reader asks for help

Some questions to ask yourself while you are reading and listening:
$\checkmark$ What will happen next?
$\checkmark$ Has anything like this ever happened to you?
$\checkmark$ How do the characters feel?
In between each person's turn reading, stop to discuss what you have read so far:
$\checkmark$ What do you think about... happening?
$\checkmark$ Describe what (character or setting) looks like.
$\checkmark$ How did you feel as you read this part?
$\checkmark$ Why do you think...?
$\checkmark$ Do you know anyone like...?
$\checkmark$ Has this ever happened to you?
Make up your own questions. Can you ask a fat question? Can you ask a skinny question?

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
